

School Council Update – March 2025

At the start of the school year, the School Council held a week- long Poppy Appeal to raise money for the Royal British Legion. It was extremely popular, all donations were accepted and in exchange a sticker and a paper poppy were given. In addition, you could bring in £1 or 50p for a wristband, slap band, reflector and zips. With all your incredible donations we raised: £189.65, amazing!

As well as the Poppy Appeal, we attended a local memorial service, which was held at our school. The local Vicar, led the service, and we all placed a cross, with a poppy symbol on it, on a piece of netting. One representative from each of the communities placed down a wreath, including the School Council. To end the event, we held a two minutes silence to remember those who we lost.

To celebrate the joy of Christmas we held a Christmas Bake Sale. The event was optional, but all entries were given a prize, and 1st, 2nd and 3rd were given an extra treat. To purchase one of the many available treats, a 50p donation was required and many people baked and ate the delicious treats. All money was then donated to the school fund.

It was a huge success, we learnt several ideas we could use to help them with settling in and reading.
